Each applicant will need to furnish a copy of their most recent heating and electric bill, original Social Security or I-94 card for each household member, and proof of the household's income for the past month (30 days), the past twelve months, or the most recent calendar year (tax return 2019 or 2020.) Applicants eligible for an award will be paid on a first-come, first-served basis and all payments are subject to availability of funds. Lenten series by Emily Hoffman

<u>Introduction</u> – During the season of Lent, the church travels with Jesus on the road to the cross. As we prepare to remember our Savior's betrayal, arrest, suffering and death, we reflect on what things in our lives we may need to put to death so we can live in the newness of Jesus' resurrection and ascension. We will mark the weeks of Lent by lighting candles in the sanctuary; these same candles will be extinguished for Good Friday as we remember the crucifixion. May the light of Christ shine more deeply into our hearts as we walk this road with Him, revealing the darkness within us and making us new.

First Sunday in Lent

As we enter the season of Lent, we look to Jesus, our Savior. We remember that He is our Prophet, Priest, and King; He has all authority in heaven and on earth; and He reigns as our risen Lord. It is through Christ's sacrifice that we are able to come before our God, and so we look to Him to save us and our world.

Hear these words from Hebrews 4: "Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has ascended into heaven, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold firmly to the faith we profess. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to empathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are – yet He did not sin. Let us then approach God's throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need." Hebrews 4:14-16
