

Stop Doubting Your Worth

It's common for us to doubt our value and significance. Yet, in Psalm 144 David is struck by the mindblowing reality that the God of all creation, the One who bids billions of stars to shine in the heavens and commands the powerful waves of the oceans to stop at the waters' edges, cares for wee-little humans like you and me. ... (O LORD, what is man that You care for him, the son of man that You think of him? Vs 3)

"Jesus had a lot to say about this topic. When it comes to knowing the value God places on us, and the way He cares for us, let's turn to Jesus's comments about sparrows. Do you know much about these little birds? They're a dime a dozen. Highly common. Highly overlookable. The way many of us ... might feel on any given day. Look at what Jesus had to say in reference to both ordinary little sparrows (and you): 'Are not five sparrows sold for two pennies? Yet not one of them is forgotten by God. Indeed, the very hairs of your head are all numbered. Don't be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows.' Luke 12:6-7)"

"For context, Luke 12:1 tells us that Jesus was addressing 'a crowd of many thousands' when He spoke of the value God sees in each person. Many thousands. The rich. The poor. The average. The misfits. The bland. The spicy. The employed. The unemployed. The talented. The crippled. The lonely. The well. The sick. The married. The widowed. The single. The stressed-out. The curious. The masses! This wasn't just a pep talk to encourage His besties! He was talking to the gamut of humanity. This is important because it makes those words He spoke that much more amazing."

"Think about what He said! You know those sparrows that are sold in the marketplace for next to nothing? Those overpopulated little flyers? My Father doesn't forget even one of them! He remembers them all. You know what this means, don't you? God remembers and sees YOU too. YOU. HAVE. VALUE. You are not forgotten by God."

"God sees everything about you – even your screw-ups, failings, fears and doubts – and He finds value. Parents don't love their children any more or less because of the way they dress or because of how well they can sing, throw a football, or pray publicly. God doesn't love you and me any more or less because of what we can or cannot do, or because of how good or bad we are either. He loves us because we are His. Made in His image. Fashioned by His heart."

"Believe it. Even if your life wasn't planned in the heart of your parents, it was planned in the heart of God. You are His, and He remembers you. By name. You, me and the stars. He knows us all by name. God cares for you and knows all about you. He knows how you like your coffee. He knows your weaknesses and insecurities. He knows all of the things that make you unique, even if you're an identical twin! He knows the things that make you tick, the quirky things, the things that cause you to beat yourself up, and the things that put a fire in your belly. And He knows how many hairs are on your head."

"... And Jesus didn't stop there. He looked those people eyeball to eyeball and told them, You...and you...and you...and you...are worth more than a whole mess of sparrows! Because you are His. Handcrafted with divine devotion. Jesus made it clear: In God's eyes, you are valued. You are loved, cherished, seen, and adored. Don't doubt it for a second!"



HÝMN OF THE MONTH: *"THERE SHALL BE SHOWERS OF BLESSING"*

"I will cause showers to come down in their season; there shall be showers of blessing." Ezekiel 34:26 (NKJV)

"There Shall be Showers of Blessing" by Major Daniel Whittle is one of those songs which, if learned in childhood, is never forgotten. Based on Ezekiel 34:26, it uplifts us with the happy assurance of God's unceasing blessing on our lives, even during our worst days.

When Howard Rutledge's plane was shot down over Vietnam, he parachuted into a little village and was immediately attacked and imprisoned. For the next seven years he endured brutal treatment. His food was little more than a bowl of pig fat. He was frequently cold, alone, and often tortured. How did he keep his sanity?

In his book, *In the Presence of Mine Enemies*, Rutledge wrote, "I wanted to talk about God and Christ and the church. But in Heartbreak (his concentration camp), there was no pastor, no Sunday school teacher, no Bible, no hymnbook ... I had completely neglected the spiritual dimension of my life. It took prison to show me how empty life is without God, and so I had to go back in my memory to those Sunday school days in Tulsa, Oklahoma. If I couldn't have a Bible and hymnbook, I would try to rebuild them in my mind.

"I tried desperately to recall ... gospel choruses from childhood, and hymns we sang in church. The first three dozen songs were fairly easy. Every day I'd try to recall another verse or a new song. One night there was a huge thunderstorm - it was the season of the monsoon rains - and a bolt of lightning knocked out the lights and plunged the entire prison into darkness. I had been going over hymn tunes in my mind and stopped to lie down and sleep when the rains began to fall. The darkened prison echoed with wave after wave of water. Suddenly, I was humming my thirty-seventh song, one I had entirely forgotten since childhood.

Showers of blessing, showers of blessing we need! Mercy drops round us are falling, but for the showers we plead.

"The enemy knew that the best way to break a man's resistance was to crush his spirit in a lonely cell," Howard wrote. "In other words, some POWs after solitary confinement lay down in a fetal position and died. All this talk of Scripture and hymns may seem boring to some, but it was the way we conquered our enemy and overcame the power of death around us."

CLEANSE YOUR HEART – Get Spiritually Health - The Bible encourages us to draw close to God and allow our hearts and bodies to be cleansed. We can't clean ourselves. We must draw near to God and ask Him to do the cleaning. Read Psalm 51:10 and Hebrews 10:22.

CLEAN OUT YOUR MOUTH – Deep Clean Inside and Out – Spiritual cleaning requires deep cleaning that goes beyond what others see and hear. It's a cleansing from within. As your heart gets clean, your language should follow – bad language, negative talk, even complaining and pessimistic thoughts contradict the Word of God. See Luke 6:45 and Philippians 2:14.

REPENT FROM HIDDEN SIN – Clean out Your Spiritual Closets – Hidden sin will destroy your life, your peace, even your heart. Reach out for help and confess your sin to someone, and the heaviness and guilt from hidden sin will leave. See Psalm 32 & 35.

RELEASE UNFORGIVENESS AND BITTERNESS – Get Rid of Old Baggage – Long kept unforgiveness and bitterness is like old baggage in the attic you just can't seem to part with. You are so familiar with it you don't even realize how it is hindering your life. Read Hebrews 12:1 and Ephesians 4:31-32.

INVOLVE JESUS IN YOUR DAILY LIFE – Let the Son Shine In – God wants your friendship and to be involved in the big and small moments of your life. Open up and let the light of God's presence shine into every part of your life, and you'll have no need for a yearly spiritual cleaning. You'll have a moment to moment refreshing of the Spirit. See 1 Corinthians 1:9 and Psalm 56:13.

LEARN TO LAUGH AT YOURSELF AND AT LIFE – Some of us take life and/or ourselves too seriously. Jesus wants you to enjoy yourself, and learn to have some fun. God made you for His pleasure! Read Psalm 28:7 and Psalm 126:2.
