Unclaimed Spiritual Wealth

This is an article I've been saving from Pastor Greg Laurie. I think it's a great thing to keep in mind for 2025. I hope you feel the same!

"And hope does not disappoint us, because God has poured out His love into our hearts by the Holy Spirit, whom He has given us." Romans 5:5

"I read an article about a couple in Louisiana who were cleaning up their home and came across an unclaimed lottery ticket worth \$1.8 million. They bought it and had forgotten about it. It was still valid, so they went and claimed their winnings.

That's like us sometimes. Many of us live as though we're spiritually impoverished. We say, 'I need more love, more faith, and more peace.' Yet God is saying, 'I've given these things to you already.'

Romans 5:5 tells us, 'For we know how dearly God loves us, because He has given us the Holy Spirit to fill our hearts with His love.' (NLT)

In fact, the first 11 verses of Romans 5 show us some of the amazing things that God has done for us. We have peace with Him (verse 1). We have free and open access into the presence of God, and we have the hope of glory (verse 2). In addition, we have God's love toward us, and we won't face judgment (verses 5-10). Finally, we have joy in the Lord (verse 11).

So God already has given us what we need. But I think at times we're praying for what we already have. Let's say, for example, that you're having troubles in your marriage. The romance is gone, and you're beginning to wonder if the marriage will even last. You're saying, 'I just don't feel the love.' Why don't you start doing loving things instead of waiting to feel the love?


Or maybe you're thinking, 'Well, someone has hurt me. I can't forgive them. I just don't feel it.'

Do it anyway. The emotions will catch up.

Instead of praying to feel forgiveness, instead of praying for more love, just start doing loving things. In time, I think your emotions will match your actions."



HYMN OF THE MONTH: "SAFE IN THE ARMS OF JESUS"

"And He took them up in His arms, laid His hands on them, and blessed them." Mark 10:16

On March 5, 1858, Fanny Crosby, the blind hymnist and America's "Queen of Gospel Songs," quietly married Alexander Van Alsteine. A year later, the couple suffered a tragedy that shook the deepest regions of Fanny's heart.

She gave birth to a child - no one knows if it was a boy or a girl. In later years, she never spoke about it except to say in her oral biography, "God gave us a tender babe," and "soon the angels came down and took our infant up to God and His throne."

One of Fanny's relatives, Florence Paine, lived with the poet for six years and could never get her to talk about this. The child's death seemed to have devastated her, and she privately bore the sadness all her life.

Years later, on April 30, 1868, musician Howard Doane knocked on the door of Fanny's apartment in Manhattan. "I have exactly forty minutes," he said, "before I must meet a train for Cincinnati. I have a tune for you. See if it says anything to you. Perhaps you can commit it to memory and then compose a poem to match it." He then hummed the tune.

Fanny clapped her hands and said, "Why, that says, 'Safe in the arms of Jesus!'" She retreated to the other room of her tiny apartment, knelt on the floor, and asked God to give her the words quickly. Within half an hour, she had composed the poem in her mind and dictated it to Doane, who dashed off to catch his train.

During her lifetime, "Safe in the Arms of Jesus" was among the most widely sung of Fanny's hymns, and she considered it in a class by itself. She claimed it was written for the bereaved, especially for mothers who had lost children. Often when comforting a grief-stricken mother, she would say, "Remember, my dear, your darling cherub is safe in the arms of Jesus." Rev. John Hall of New York's Fifth Avenue Presbyterian Church told Fanny that her hymn had given more "peace and satisfaction to mothers who have lost their children than any other hymn I have ever known."

It isn't hard to understand why.

Safe in the arms of Jesus, safe on His gentle breast; There by His love o'ershaded, sweetly my soul shall rest.


